Highlights

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Tivoli Gardens
10 min

Tivoli Gardens is a famous amusement park. It opened is 1843 which makes it the second-oldest operating amusement park in the world, after Dyrehavsbakken, also in Denmark. The park is best known for its wooden roller coaster, Rutschebanen, built in 1914, still operating today.



Stroget pedestrian street
30 min

Technically speaking Stroget isn't one street, but the chain of pedestrian streets and small plazas making the longest shopping promenade of Europe. It's the major must see of Copenhagen. The stroll along the street, picking into the shops or stopping for a cup of coffee is one of Copenhagen's greatest experiences.



Nyhavn
20 min

Nyhavn means a New Harbor, it is a 17th-century waterfront, canal and entertainment district, one of most beautiful areas of the city. It's famous for brightly colored 17th and early 18th century townhouses and bars, cafes and restaurants. The canal harbors many historical wooden ships, which are definitely worth seeing.



Little Mermaid
10 min

The Little Mermaid at the seashore is something you shouldn't miss. Bases on Andersen's story character; she appeared here in the beginning of the 20th century and since then had become the symbol of Copenhagen and Denmark. She's sitting on the stone not far from the castle, observing with a little sadness the wide panorama of the bay.



Kronborg castle
30 min

Kronborg is a castle in the town of Helsingør, not far from the border of Denmark and Sweden. The castle's story dates back to the 1420s. It's a textbook fortification with thick walls and sharp bastions. Kronborg is known to many the setting of William Shakespeare's famous tragedy Hamlet.



Kongens Nytorv Square

20 min

Kongens Nytorv (New Kings square) is located at the end of the Stroget street. It's the largest square of Copenhagen. Important buildings facing the square include the Royal Danish Theater, the Charlottenborg Palace (now the Royal Danish Academy of Fine Arts), the Thott Palace (now the French Embassy), the Hotel D'Angleterre and the Magasin du Nord department store.



Frederiksborg Castle

30 min

Frederiksborg is a royal castle, located in the town of Hillerød. It's one of most beautiful 16-17th century castles of Denmark. It is occupied by the National History Museum, founded in 19th century.



Christiansborg Palace

30 min

Christiansborg Palace is a palace and government building on the islet of Slotsholmen. It is the seat of the Danish Parliament, the Danish Prime Minister's Office and the Supreme Court of Denmark. Also, several parts of the palace are used by the Danish king, including the Royal Reception Rooms, the Palace Chapel and the Royal Stables. The palace can be visited with the pre booked tour.



Amalienborg castle

10 min

Amalienborg is the home of the Danish royal family. The palace is named after Amalia, the wife of Friederich the 3rd, who was the first one to here. It's unique because it isn't just a building, but a whole plaza, composed of the identical buildings, each named after different kings of Denmark with Friederich 5th statue in the middle. The green embankment in front of the palace complex had the great view on the Ekvipagemestervej opera theater.
