Charlottenburg Castle

90 min

Charlottenburg is the most beautiful baroque palace of Berlin dating 1699. Named after Charlotte, the wife of Friedrich I, this palace and the palace park on the Shpree river coast are one of three Prussian royal residences, located in Berlin itself and the earliest of those.



Holocaust Memorial

15 min

Holocaust Memorial or the Memorial to the Murdered Jews of Europe is located near the Tiergarten, 150 yards south from the Brandenburg gate. The site is covered with 2,711 concrete slabs or "stelae", arranged in a grid pattern on a sloping field. The memorial was designed by Peter Eisenman - a prominent American architect.



Brandenburg Gate

20 min

Brandenburg gate is the main symbol of Berlin and Germany itself. Located at the beginning of Unter den Linden street, and the boarder of the Tiergarten, it's the only remaining 18th century city gate of Berlin. Brandenburg gate was the important landmark of the cold war time as the most significant border of the Soviet and British sections of the divided city.



Museum Island

20 min

Museum Island is the name of the northern half of an island in the Spree river. It is called so for the complex of five internationally significant museums located there: Altes Museum (Old Museum), Neues Museum (New Museum), Alte Nationalgalerie (Old National Gallery), Pergamon Museum, the Middle East museum.



Reichstag

20 min

Reichstag building is the meeting center of the Bundestag, the German parliament. It was the arena for the culmination of the Battle of Berlin of WW2, when Soviet army put the red flag above the damaged building. Shortly after the demolition of the Berlin wall, in 1995 reconstruction, the huge glass dome appeared on the top of the building, as the observation spot for tourists with the brilliant views of Tiergarten, Spree and the center of Berlin.



Chekpoint Charlie

20 min

Checkpoint Charlie is one of 3 checkpoints on the border of Soviet and American sectors of Berlin during the cold war. The checkpoints were indicated by letters - Alfa, Bravo, Charlie. With the Berlin wall demolition, the checkpoints were removed as well. Checkpoint Charlie stayed as a memory. The Berlin wall museum, also called Museum Haus at Checkpoint Charlie tells the history of the escape attempts during the Berlin wall times.



Berlin Wall

30 min

Berlin wall was a 155km structure that separated the West Berlin from the surrounding pro-Soviet GDR and East Berlin in 1961-1989. It is one of the major cold war symbols. After the demolition of the wall, sections of it were left around the city as the memorials. The largest Berlin wall section can be seen on the coast of the Spree, not far from Ostbahnhof. The wall is covered with graffiti, including the famous "Kiss of Brezhnev and Honecker ".



Berlin Cathedral

20 min

Berlin Cathedral is an impressive baroque structure, dating to 1905. The park in front of the palace is a quite area, just 10 footsteps away from the busy street. The cathedral operates as the museum with the guided tours and the admission charge through most of the day, but it's free of charge during the worship time at noon and 6 pm. Dome walkway 270 steps above the ground if worth a visit with the magnificent panorama of the city from the top.



Sachsenhausen

45 min

Sachsenhausen or "Saxon's Houses" was a Nazi concentration camp in Oranienburg, Germany, used primarily for political prisoners from 1936 to the May of 1945. After World War II, when Oranienburg was in the Soviet Occupation Zone, the structure was used as an NKVD special camp until 1950. The camp ground with the remaining buildings is now open to the public as a museum.

After you get to ride through the typical Northern Germany flatlands you will be able to explore the Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp Memorial together with your group guide. Our professional guide will tell you about the terrible events which have happened inside the camp during the Nazi era.

09:30 - 10:30

Visit to the Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp Memorial.

10:30 - 11:30

Continue drive to Berlin.

11:30 - 13:30

The panoramic tour of the German capital starts with a visit to the Reichstag, which now is actually Bundestag - the German Parliament Building and the Brandenburg Gate. The journey includes sightseeing of the Berlin Cathedral, Museum Island, Victory Column, the Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church, the famous Unter den Linden street. One of the most important places on tour are the Third Reich and the Cold War landmarks - Hermann Goring's Aviation Ministry, Hitler's Bunker, Berlin Wall, and Checkpoint Charlie.

13:30 - 14:30

Break for lunch at a city cafe/restaurant (self-paid).

14:30 - 15:30

Together with the driver and the guide you will also pass the Alexanderplatz Square, the Humboldt University, the Red City Hall. If we have some spare time, the guide will also take you to the symbol of Western Germany - KaDeWe shopping center, as well as the Bellevue & Charlottenburq palaces. You can
